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Dear Parents and Carers,

Please find enclosed your child's individual exam and revision session timetable. This will help your child to plan their revision, as well as helping you all stay organised throughout the changes that take place during the exam season.

Please note the following essential information:

- All morning exams begin at 9.30am and all afternoon exams begin at 1pm. <u>It is essential</u> <u>that your child is on time for their exams.</u> If they arrive too late, the exam boards may not accept their papers and they could score zero for that paper.
- Study leave begins after school on Friday 7th June. <u>Until that time, all students must</u> attend school as normal.
- Until the 7th June, there will be a large number of additional study sessions put on to help
 your child to prepare for their exams. These have proven to be extremely helpful in recent
 years and <u>it is essential that your child remains in school to attend these sessions</u>.
- There are a number of essential revision sessions taking place in the afternoon, following a
 morning exam, or in the morning, to prepare for an afternoon exam. Therefore, until 7th June,
 students are not permitted to go home after a morning exam or stay at home in the
 morning of an afternoon exam.
- Where there is a morning exam and no time the previous afternoon to offer a revision session, we are putting on breakfast sessions from 8.30am <u>free breakfast will be</u> <u>provided</u>. These are designed to help your child with any last-minute questions, hints and exam tips, and to help ensure they are in the right frame of mind going into the exam. All students are encouraged to attend these sessions.
- In addition to the ongoing revision sessions during enrichment, there will be some specific additional revision sessions after school for Maths (15th May), Physics (20th May Ash students only) and English (22nd May and 5th June). We expect all students to attend these sessions.

We are so proud of all our Year 11 students for the incredible progress they have made since joining JPC. We know that with one last push together, we can ensure that they are given the best possible chance of achieving the success in their GCSE exams that they so richly deserve. We thank you in advance for your support.
