Theme: Perspective Taking

The Boring Moment 5

## Aims:

- For students to understand the term, 'The Boring Moment'.
- For students to know that 'The Boring Moment' is part of everyone's day, every day!
- For students to be able to recognise when they are experiencing 'The Boring Moment'.
- For students to be able to recognise what they do (their behaviour) during 'The Boring Moment'.
- For students to know what they should (ideally) do during 'The Boring Moment' (be a good 'Social Fake').
- For students to be able to take on the role of the 'Social Fake' during 'The Boring Moment'.

	this 'Boring Moment' and present as the best 'Social	
	Fake' that they can (as in a previous ST session).	
	Remind them of behaviours that they can use to show that they are interested such as looking your way, smiling, nodding, maybe even asking questions.	
	Afterwards pick out the best 'Social Fake' and say why they were so good at looking interested.	
	Say how it made you feel and what you thought about them. Ask them to say how they felt inside. Emphasise how what we feel on the inside can be different to what we show in the outside.	
	Ask the students to reflect on one thing that they can practice in school/at home when experiencing 'Boring Moments'. Possibly refer to their completed 'Boring Moments' worksheets to support this process.
